As stated in Article V, Section II, Part (c) of the Election Regulations:

"Any candidate or member of the candidate's staff who violates departmental or university regulations, or Texas A&M University Student Rules, in an action <u>related to campaigning</u> shall be subject to disciplinary action by the Election Commission."

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the following additions to the published Election Regulations will be made due to recent university regulations:

Social distancing is strongly encouraged in all contexts of campaign activity.

<u>Failure abide by Texas A&M University's posted Face Covering Guidance</u> during any campaign activity **will result in a minor violation**. Please visit <u>this link</u> to review this guidance prior to participating in any campaign activity.

<u>All indoor campaign activity must abide by posted modified occupancy rules</u> as set by the University Center & Special Events. Failure to comply **will result in a minor violation**.

All outdoor campaign activity with attendance of 10 or more persons may take place only upon receiving approval from University Center and Special Events or the appropriate reserving authority. <u>Hosting an outdoor event without receiving the proper approval will result in a minor violation</u>.

<u>Candidates are not to distribute any physical campaign material amongst other persons in areas</u> <u>other than outside the Commons Dining Hall or the Wehner building.</u> Examples of campaign material include, but are not limited to, flyers, pamphlets, t-shirts, and buttons. Candidates found distributing physical campaign materials amongst other people in an unauthorized area **will be assessed a minor violation**.
